FOR SMALL MANUFACTURERS WITH 250 OR FEWER EMPLOYEES

Millions of workers that are engaged in the manufacture of automobiles, farm equipment, aircraft, heavy machinery, chemicals, adhesives and other related products are exposed to these potentially harmful substances. Contact is known to cause lung problems and skin irritations as well as asthma, chronic bronchitis, and contact dermatitis.

Health hazards are a concern for all employers. Industrial accidents and health issues are usually caused by employees not understanding the hazards of the existing chemicals in their work environments.

With help from a grant from the U.S. Department of Labor, IMEC is providing in-depth training and technical assistance – at no cost – to enable Illinois manufacturers to recognize, prevent, and avoid workplace safety and health hazards associated with exposure to chemical agents. The workshop will integrate safety and health responsibilities, with management techniques and operational tactics.

Of the 228,000 occupational illnesses recorded in 2006, skin diseases or disorders were the most common with 41,400 new cases. Respiratory conditions represented 17,700 and poisonings 3,400.
